## **Progress Report on Monitoring and Reforestation**

CI, park rangers, and local community members conduct monthly monitoring of the trees that have been planted. Because trees can be affected by factors such as weather, pests, and human activities, such monitoring is crucial to ensure that they are growing healthy and strong. The majority of the 120,000 trees planted in 300 hectares of land are in good shape.


